Evangelism Topics God's Kingdom as a Foreign Country – Kaori Egawa's Diary

On May 8th, I was invited to a "Travel Radio" radio program hosted by TOKYO 854 Kurume Radio Station. This program introduces guests with overseas connections to their respective countries. Due to my father's job, I lived in Calgary, Canada, for three years of my childhood (age 8-11) in the '80s. My Travel Radio host had excellent questions for me to answer, which led me to dig deep into my memories.



In the program, I was asked about the way I felt when I left Japan for the first time and some new food I ate in Canada, which surprised me. I had wonderful responses from the listeners, and I am very grateful that I could share my experiences in this way.

Talking on this radio show gave me a new perspective on Christian cultural awareness in Japan. Through baptism, we are **adopted into God's family and granted citizenship of God's Kingdom.** In a way, God's kingdom is a "foreign country" to those who have not yet accepted God's call to heaven.

With that being said, it is easy to imagine that there are a considerable number of non-Christians in Japan who have various questions about God's Kingdom". We should be ready to casually share our personal stories with non-Christians in order to carry out our Christian mission (Matt 28:19,20) in this country.

It is said that 99 percent of the Japanese population is non-Christian. Even in this heathen country, the door to heaven is still open today. I hope for the joy of being God's child and a citizen of God's Kingdom to be communicated to many people throughout my native country. I hope that we learn the Bible well and always be ready to answer people's questions as kindly and clearly as possible using the tools God has entrusted us, such as the Small Catechism, Christian Apps like TELL and YouVersion, and through books, music, and art. In the radio program, I asked the radio host to play my song recording, **"What a Friend We Have in Jesus"** in both English and Japanese. This hymn is the most well-known hymn in Japan. I humbly pray that many seeds of the beautiful teachings of the Bible be sown in all 47 prefectures in Japan. I am privileged to play a small part in it.
