#### Opening doors in Advent and beyond

The Advent calendar is a unique way of counting the days until Christmas. It's a tradition where children open one small door each day on a thick paper card, revealing hidden Christmas images or characters behind it. I have cherished this tradition since childhood and have raised my children with similar experiences.



The simple act of opening a door each day on the Advent calendar symbolizes life's journey. The image of Jesus Christ that appears on December 25th holds the greatest significance. Our lives are like the Advent calendar, opening new doors daily. However, the day will come when we open the final door marked 'The End.' This represents either our death or the second coming of Jesus. The Bible describes this as the moment when the door between time and eternity is opened. When Jesus opens this door, a new life in a new heaven and new earth awaits believers. This became possible through Jesus' sacrifice for us. The deeper message behind the Advent calendar reminds us of the importance of knowing God's love and embracing our salvation.

#### A season of miracles

"A 'miracle' originally means an event where natural laws are broken by the power of God. The term 'miracle' is often heard in everyday life. For example, when an unlikely sports team wins, we refer to it as a 'miraculous victory.' However, events like the sea parting in two in Moses' time, Jesus turning water into wine, or Jesus resurrecting Lazarus from the dead, fit perfectly into this definition as genuine miracles. Particularly at Christmas, we celebrate the miraculous birth of Jesus. This refers to the birth of Jesus, the son of Mary, as prophesied by Isaiah and recorded by Luke. Mary was visited by an angel who told her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and you will bear the Son of God,' and she conceived a child while still a virgin through God's supernatural intervention. The Apostle John wrote, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory" (John 1:1,14). The true joy of Christmas lies in the peace brought by Jesus' birth and God's promise of salvation. God became human, suffered, died, and was resurrected, welcoming us as part of God's family. This miracle is at the core of the Christmas celebration and its greatest reason. Merry Christmas!"
