#### It's All About Christ

For 175 years since the beginning of WELS, we have experienced many different events throughout our long history. There have been wars, economic downturns, social changes, and outbreaks of disease. Yet through it all, we remember how Christ has protected and guided us every step of the way. It is only because of His work that the church has been preserved and has continued to grow until today.

Now we are undertaking a bold challenge: to open 100 new mission sites in the next 10 years. There are challenges—such as financial needs and a shortage of pastors—but with the strength and resources God has given us, we are striving to bring the gospel to as many people as possible.

The work of the gospel is also spreading overseas. New missionaries have recently been sent to **the United Kingdom and Australia**, and in **Vietnam**, Lutheran pastors are studying theology. In many countries around the world, Lutheran churches are growing and walking hand in hand with WELS.

In our schools and seminary, the training of new pastors and teachers continues. Through those who are sent out, Christ Himself will continue to raise up laborers for His harvest fields. In local congregations as well, Christ strengthens His people through **the Word and the**Sacraments. We do not need flashy methods or special gimmicks. The gospel itself nurtures faith and gives us strength. From there, people go out into their communities, inviting their neighbors with the words, "Come and see." (John 1:46)

All of this is Christ's work. And what an amazing thing it is that He allows us to be part of it. Though we are sinful, He still uses us and lets us take part in the work of His kingdom. For this we give Him our heartfelt thanks.

#### **Parent Conversations**

Children grow up so quickly. The baby becomes an elementary school student, and before long, a teenager. The role of parents changes over time, but one truth never changes: **both our lives and our parenting have meaning in Christ.** 

God has entrusted parents with the special mission of leading their children to faith. Trusting in the power of His Word, we walk in prayer that it will take deep root in their hearts. Our desire is that our children may grow to be—

- Humble Christians, who confess their sins and find rest in Christ's salvation
- Grateful children of God, who treasure worship and prayer
- Learners, who continue to study God's Word
- **Disciples**, who live out God's law and gospel in daily life
- **Servants**, who use their gifts for God and for others
- **Witnesses**, who speak of the hope they have in Jesus.

To help them grow in this way, parents can do three things: 1. **Be an example.** Not in perfection, but by showing a life of faith rooted in Jesus. 2. **Speak the Word.** Point to God's truth in everyday conversations. 3. **Protect and correct.** Guard the child's heart, and when mistakes are made, guide with grace.

We are imperfect parents, but **Christ's perfect** work covers all our shortcomings. Children belong not only to our families, but also to God's family. Let us believe that faith is nurtured through both words and example, and continue daily in prayer.
